Teachers' Professional Development- Debbie Buckingham

Part of my role as Director of Teaching and Learning is to facilitate opportunities for teachers across the MAT to share good practice and learn from each other. Subject leaders meet regularly to discuss the use of resources,

teaching strategies and often visit the schools within the MAT.

Every term we try to ensure teachers get together to review a subject or benchmark standards particularly in writing. Moderating Writing is designed to help schools to make consistent judgements about pupils' attainment. Sometimes we use external advisors to strengthen our expertise or speakers. In June all staff are getting together for a joint session on teaching vocabulary. The use of Technology is instrumental for staff to share ideas and resources. As a Trust we have created 'Teams' which is an on-line facility for all staff to communicate across the MAT.
